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CSLB Welcomes New and Returning Board Members

Administrative policy for all CSLB operations is guided by a fifteen-member board. The Board is comprised of five contractor members and 10 public members.

The contractor members include one "A" General Engineering contractor, two "B" General Building contractors, and two "C" Specialty contractors. The public members include one labor representative, one local building official, and one who is a representative of a statewide senior citizen organization. The Governor is responsible for 11 appointments; the Senate Rules Committee for two appointments, and the Assembly Speaker for two appointments.

Board members receive compensation of \$100 per diem for each day spent on Board business, plus expenses. This is a small price to pay for the expertise and dedication CSLB receives in exchange.



On behalf of the state's construction industry, CSLB welcomes the following new and returning Board members:

Pastor Herrera Jr., of Los Angeles, was appointed to the Board by Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger on July 20, 2010. From 1991-2010, Mr. Herrera served as the Los Angeles County director of consumer affairs. He previously served Los Angeles County as assistant director of consumer affairs from 1981 to 1991, head of staff services from 1980 to 1981, head consumer affairs representative from 1977 to 1980, and consumer affairs investigator from 1976 to 1977. Mr. Herrera is a member of the UCLA Latino Alumni Association; National Association of Consumer Agency Administrators; Consumer Federation of California; Consumer Action; Los Angeles Financial Credit Union Board of Directors; National Consumers League; and is a founding member of Los Angeles County Hispanic Managers. Mr. Herrera's term continues through June 1, 2014.

Ed Lang, of Rancho Cordova, was reappointed to the Board by Governor Schwarzenegger on July 20, 2010, where he has served as a member since 2007. 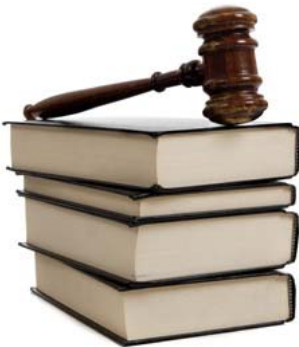

But, Your Honor, I Was Licensed

During these tough economic times it is more important than ever to manage your business costs. However, it is always wise to avoid cost-cutting schemes that could end up being an expensive lesson. In fact, failure to properly maintain your license and conduct your business as required by the California Contractors License Law (Business and Professions Code Sections 7000 – 7199) could end up costing you a great deal more than any savings anticipated by trying to "outsmart the system." From a purely business perspective, it simply is not worth the risk, as demonstrated by the following precedent-setting case. Read further to learn how a contractor whose license record had not shown a break in service was determined by the courts to be unlicensed, and ordered to return approximately \$27,000 to the homeowner, pay \$10,000 in punitive damages and approximately \$97,000 in attorney fees and costs.



In *Laurence Wright v. Ghyath Issak et al.*, a dispute arose over an incomplete remodeling job and the contractor sued for breach of contract to recover \$11,000. The homeowners answered the complaint by alleging that Wright was not a licensed contractor. Under state law, an unlicensed contractor cannot sue for unpaid work that requires a license. The homeowners (defendants) also counter-sued for fraud and related causes of action to regain the entire amount they had paid to the contractor. The trial court found for the defendants on the basis that, by under-reporting payroll to the workers' compensation insurance carrier, the contractor had been unlicensed during the project and was not entitled to an action for compensation and could be forced to repay all funds paid to him (Business and Professions Code Section 7031). Review of the appellate court decision provides important insight into the trial court's ruling.

Upon appeal, the contractor argued that he had been licensed at all times, had a workers' compensation insurance policy, and never received a notice of suspension from the Registrar of Contractors for not obtaining a policy. However, the court of appeal disagreed with the contractor regarding his license status. As the court explained:

In relevant summary, Section 7125.2 states that a contractor's license is automatically suspended as of the date the contractor was required to obtain workers' compensation insurance but did not. This language cannot be clearer. Its effect is that, because plaintiff underreported his payroll and, thus, did not obtain workers' compensation insurance in 2004, plaintiff's license was suspended before, during, and after he performed work on defendants' home.

Bottom line: the contractor was found to be unlicensed before, during, and after he performed work on the defendants' home and at least as far back as 2004 because, regardless of what is reflected in the license record, his license had been automatically suspended by operation of B&P Code Section 7125.2 (automatic suspension for failure to obtain or maintain workers' compensation insurance). Because of his duplicity, the contractor's suit to recover \$11,000 resulted in a \$137,000 debt.



Clear Non-CSLB Suspensions or Risk Losing Contractor License Renewal Fees

CSLB is unable to renew active contractor licenses for corporations on suspension by the California Secretary of State. Most suspensions are for failure to pay Franchise Tax Board obligations. Also, CSLB cannot renew an active license if the licensee has an outstanding obligation to the Employee Development Department or Department of Industrial Relations. Any fee paid to CSLB for an application cannot be refunded, according to Business and Professions Code Section 7138.

Contractor renewal application forms list the suspensions that bar CSLB from renewing their license or giving a refund. If you are under any of these suspensions, make sure you clear those *before* sending your CSLB renewal application. CSLB is able to renew a license on inactive status, even if a suspension exists for the reasons listed above.

Avoid Financial Complaints Against Your License

More than 15 percent of the complaints CSLB received during the 2009-2010 fiscal year were about contractors who failed to pay subcontractors or materials suppliers. Contractors must have sufficient funds to pay for the supplies and the labor required for each contract they bid.



If suppliers and subcontractors file a complaint with CSLB, the contractor who failed to pay them could be cited under Business and Professions (B&P) Code Section 7120 for failure to pay for materials or services. If you are cited for 7120, you could face civil penalty fines of \$200 to \$2,000.

Also, don't use funds received from a new client's job to pay your subs or suppliers from a previous project. Doing so could subject you to fines between \$200 and \$5,000 for violating B&P Code Section 7108 for diversion or misapplication of funds. Diversion of construction funds can also subject you to criminal prosecution, which carries fines of up to \$10,000 and state prison or county jail time up to one year for violation of Penal Code Section 484(b).

In addition to citations and fines for such violations, your license could be subjected to suspension or revocation. Subcontractors and suppliers may also seek payment through your contractor license bond or through a lawsuit in the civil court system. If subs or suppliers file a lien on the homeowner to recover costs, the homeowner might also pursue a complaint against your license through CSLB, or attempt to recover financial losses through your license bond or the civil courts.

One License Does Affect the Other

If you ignore consumer complaints filed against your license or already have a disciplinary action pending and think you can escape responsibility by disassociating from that license and switching to another active license, reactive an inactive license, or apply for and obtain a new license, think again.

When a license is suspended or revoked through a disciplinary action, all other licenses held by the qualifier will likewise be subject to suspension or revocation. Similarly, any separately held license of non-qualifying principals who are listed on a corporate or partnership license may be suspended or revoked if the individual(s) had knowledge of or participated in a violation that resulted in a disciplinary action.

With regard to a civil judgment against a license, all principals of the license are responsible for satisfying the judgment. Failure to satisfy a final judgment will subject the license to suspension, and any other license held by the principals will also be placed under judgment bond suspension.

Judgment Notification is Your Responsibility

Remember to notify CSLB of any unsatisfied judgment within 90 days of it being issued. If the licensee fails to make CSLB aware of that judgment in the allotted time and CSLB learns of it through a consumer complaint or other means, that license is subject to automatic suspension under Business and Profession Code Section 7071.17.

CSLB allows licensees 90 days from receipt of notification to satisfy the judgment if it is received within 90 days of the judgment entry date. If the licensee submits proof that the judgment was paid or that a payment plan has been established, no mention of the judgment will appear when an instant license check is conducted for that contractor on CSLB's website.



Premium Hikes for Surety Bonds Probed by State Insurance Commissioner

Complaints and questions from licensed contractors, CSLB, and elected officials about significant price hikes for many contractor license bond premiums have prompted an inquiry by the California Department of Insurance (DOI).

DOI's ombudsman, in a letter to CSLB Registrar Steve Sands, says the department's research is not yet complete, but explains that current law does not prohibit the use of credit scores for rating or underwriting commercial insurance, as is the case for private passenger auto premiums. Check Your Business Insurance Policy Before Changing the Scope of Your Work

I don't have to tell you that the construction industry is facing some tough times. I'm certain you're tired of being reminded of it.

As a result, a lot of builders and tradesmen have made the decision to widen the scope of their work. Where a builder may once have specialized in multi-unit dwellings, that same builder might now be pursuing single-family homes or taking on remodeling contracts. I'm aware of one builder who is looking into property management as a way to bolster his income.

From a business perspective, this decision is not only valid but often recommended. But, before doing that, I would like to implore you to examine your insurance policy to make certain your coverage extends to this new line of work.

Just because you're covered for the construction of single-family homes, does not necessarily mean you hold coverage for other work. If your prior business was all commercial construction and you decided to diversify into residential contracting, imagine your shock when you learn, after a claim, that your commercial policy contained a residential construction exclusion (some do and some do not).

An insurance policy is neither the easiest, nor the most exciting thing to read. Therefore, I strongly recommend that you seek the advice of your insurance agent to confirm you have the necessary coverage for the work you are undertaking. It is also wise that you confirm the discussion in writing so that you're protected in the event a claim arises. The last thing you want is that dreaded denial letter which can cost you precious capital and valuable time.

The best kind of claim is the one never created; therefore, I would advise you to seek the professional guidance of a risk manager to learn how to avoid these claims in the first place. You no doubt already know how to avoid the most common claims in your traditional lines of business, but a new frontier offers not only new streams of income, but new areas of risk as well. Remember, the pioneers take not only the gold, but the arrows as well.

This so called "Great Recession" can be a boon for the adventurous, outside-the-box type thinker; but it can also be a bust if the proper coverage is not in place. To ensure a happy and healthy future, you must also ensure you are insured.

Solar Energy Project Complaints

In recent weeks, the CSLB Enforcement division has received consumer complaints regarding the installation of residential solar systems. Allegations in these complaints include solar rebate program guidelines not being followed, and unlicensed contractors performing the installation work. Federal programs and utility companies follow strict guidelines about solar systems being installed by licensed professionals; Contractors State License Law requires that installation be performed by state-licensed contractors.

Additionally, CSLB is working on complaints about companies that fail to pull local building permits, misrepresent utility company or federal rebates—especially who needs to apply for them and whether the contractor or the customer should get them, the return on investment for solar power systems on residential and commercial buildings, demands for excessive down payments, and high-pressure sales whereby representatives tell a prospective customer that the "good deal" they're offering is only good for that day, failing to provide the legal three-day right to cancel the contract.

Since solar contracting work is a newly expanding construction segment, CSLB

Solar the Hot Topic



CSLB executive, licensing, and enforcement staff met with solar industry representatives on June 16, 2010, to ensure solar classification and enforcement policies reflect the current and emerging solar energy marketplace. The group reached consensus on classification definitions and agreed to develop strategies to combat solar industry scams that are occurring statewide.

Authorized Classifications for Solar Projects

The evolution of the solar energy industry has led the Contractors State License Board (CSLB) to determine which of its licensing classifications are authorized to perform solar installation and repair work. In order to perform solar installation or repair jobs in California that are valued at \$500 or more, a contractor must have a state license in at least one of the following classifications:

- **"A" – General Engineering**
- **"B" – General Building**
- **C-4 – Boiler, Hot-Water Heating and Steam Fitting** – Authorized to perform projects including solar heating equipment associated with systems authorized by this classification
- **C-10 – Electrical** – Authorized to perform any solar projects which generate, transmit, transform or utilize electrical energy in any form for any purpose.
- **C-36 – Plumbing** – Authorized to perform any project using solar equipment to heat water or fluids to a suitable temperature.
- **C-46 – Solar** – Authorized to install, modify, maintain,

Follow Rebate Rules to Cash In on "Hot" Incentives

Licensees who work in the solar energy classifications must carefully adhere to all state and federal rebate and tax credit rules. Failure to follow solar incentive guidelines could prevent your client from qualifying for these price breaks.

Remember these guidelines when entering into contracts for solar energy work:

- Make sure the name style of your business and license number is in all contracts, bids, and advertisements exactly as it appears in CSLB's records. Contracts must be in the correct form and type as specified in Business and Professions (B&P) Code Section 7159.
- Double check with your clients' utility company to make sure they will honor government incentives for your particular license classification. Although CSLB authorizes several classifications to perform solar projects, a utility company may only allow certain contractor classifications to perform the work. Make sure you and/or your company hold(s) the appropriate license classification. The contract must include a licensee with the appropriate classification for the project.
- If a salesperson enters into a contract with a client on behalf of your business, that individual

does not yet know whether there will be a significant increase in contracting problems. Unlicensed contracting, on the other hand, is a continual challenge because it is tied to the underground economy. In the past year, CSLB has strengthened its enforcement efforts and partnered with several state agencies to crack down on unlicensed and fraudulent contracting activity. Issues dealing with solar power systems now have CSLB strengthening its ties with California Building Officials and local building departments to watch for irregular solar contracting activity.

and repair thermal and photovoltaic solar energy systems. A licensee in this classification shall not undertake or perform building or construction trades, crafts or skills, *except when required to install a thermal or photovoltaic solar energy system.*

- **C-53 – Swimming Pool** – Authorized to include the installation of solar heating in swimming pool projects.

Solar "Soft Cap"

In an on-going effort to protect consumers from over-priced solar systems and prevent fraudulent federal tax claims, the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC), which oversees the California Solar Initiative (CSI), has instituted a "soft cap" of \$14.70 per watt for solar projects with applications for incentives.

Unlike a "hard cap," CSI's soft cap rules will allow administrators discretion to waive the price ceiling, provided that those seeking rebates furnish documentation justifying the higher costs if the project is priced two standard deviations above the average system costs listed in CSI's database. During the first quarter of 2010, the average system's cost ranged from \$9.21 for those less than 10 kW and \$7.66 for those larger than 10kW. Details regarding the new pricing policy are available in the June 2010 CSI Program Handbook.

must be a registered Home Improvement Salesperson (HIS) with CSLB.

- Make sure you, your company's qualifying licensee, and your HIS can present the CSLB-issued pocket card to identify yourself and your business to your potential clients.





Active Enforcement of Building Energy Efficiency Standards



A memorandum of understanding (MOU) between CSLB and the California Energy Commission was approved on June 30, 2010, to help assure that heating, ventilating, and cooling systems that are installed, repaired, or replaced in California meet the latest Building Energy Efficiency Standards (Standards).

Under the MOU, the Energy Commission will report to CSLB any allegations of violations of the permits and testing required by the Standards. The Energy Commission will assist CSLB investigations and sting operations that target potential violators, and provide testimony and documentation to support CSLB action against licensees who fail to adhere

to the Standards. CSLB will also partner with the Energy Commission for education and outreach efforts to California contractors, consumers, and building department personnel.

CSLB's contractor notification effort began in late 2009, and the board ramped up its permit compliance enforcement in January 2010, partnering with the California Building Officials (CALBO). Letters were mailed to C-20 (Warm-Air Heating, Ventilating, and Air-Conditioning, or HVAC) contractors in the cities of Fairfield, Folsom, Grand Terrace, La Puente, Porterville, Rocklin, and Whittier before a series of sting operations was conducted in those cities during February and March 2010.

Most of the 50 contractors contacted during the sting operations indicated they knew about the permits, energy, and safety requirements associated with HVAC systems. However, some offered to skirt the process in order to offer a lower bid to investigators posing as homeowners. About one third of those invited to the stings committed potential permit violations. As a result of the stings, CSLB issued six citations and two more are pending.

In addition to being in violation of the Standards, failure to pull the proper permits and assure that HVAC systems are inspected and approved is also a violation of California Business and Professions Code Sections 7110 and 7090. Contractor discipline can result in up to \$5,000 in fines per citation, as well as suspension and/or revocation of the contractor license.

CSLB distributed a [letter](#) to its nearly 12,000 C-20 license holders in July 2010 to reinforce awareness of CSLB's accelerated enforcement of Standards requirements for HVAC permits and testing. The letter explains the importance of adherence to the Standards for energy efficiency, health, and safety and the violation penalties.



Requirements for HVAC Contractors and Demolition Professionals

The Mercury Thermostat Collection Act of 2008 that became effective July 1, 2009, requires construction and demolition professionals to properly remove and dispose of out-of-service mercury-added thermostats.

HVAC Contractors who install heating, ventilation, and air-conditioning components are required to:

- Handle and transport out-of-service mercury-added thermostats in accordance with the Universal Waste Regulations (UWR) found in the California Code of Regulations, Title 22, Chapter 23. For a summary of the UWR for out-of-service mercury-added thermostats visit http://www.dtsc.ca.gov/HazardousWaste/upload/UW_-_thermostats_NS.pdf
- Take out-of-service mercury-added thermostats to a collection location that is operated in accordance with Universal Waste Regulations.



Persons engaged in building demolition are required to:

- Remove out-of-service mercury-added thermostats prior to demolition in accordance with the UWR.
- Handle and transport out-of-service mercury-added thermostats in accordance with the Universal Waste Regulations found in the California Code of Regulations, Title 22, Chapter 23. For a summary of the UWR for out-of-service mercury-added thermostats visit http://www.dtsc.ca.gov/HazardousWaste/upload/UW_-_thermostats_NS.pdf
- Take out-of-service mercury-added thermostats to a collection location that is operated in accordance with **Universal Waste Regulations**. Collection bins for out-of-service mercury-added thermostats are required, by law, to be provided at HVAC wholesaler locations in California. - Collection bins may also be found at local government agency household hazardous waste (HHW) collection facilities. To find a HHW collection facility near you, visit <http://www.dtsc.ca.gov/HazardousWaste/UniversalWaste/HHW.cfm>

Failure to comply with this law may result in penalties of up to twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for each separate violation or, for continuing violations, for each day that a violation continues.

HVAC Permit Enforcement

As a participant in the state Performance Alliance, CSLB is committed to reducing energy used by warm-air heating, ventilating, and air-conditioning (HVAC) systems.

CSLB has begun accelerating its enforcement activities to ensure that new, enhanced compliance requirements are being met for the California Code of Regulations Title 24, Part 6, "Energy Efficiency Standards for Residential and Nonresidential Buildings." Amendments to Title 24, Part 6 became effective January 1, 2010, and require enhanced duct sealing, proper refrigerant charge, airflow, and fan watt draw.

Building permits are necessary to ensure that HVAC construction is performed according to state and local codes and safety standards. Failure to obtain a permit is a violation of law and exposes the homeowner to additional costs and liability. Also, the California Mechanical Code (CMC) requires a building permit for HVAC installations and modifications including, but not limited to:

- New HVAC installation;
- HVAC changeout / remodel / replacement including the air handler, coil, furnace or condenser;
- Relocation of an existing HVAC unit;

Time and Material Contracts Not Legal for Home Improvement

For most people a "time and material contract" would be defined as an arrangement in which a contractor is paid on the basis of:

- Actual cost of direct labor, usually at specified hourly rates
- Actual cost of materials and equipment used
- Agreed-upon fixed add-ons to cover the contractor's overhead and profit (income)

This type of arrangement is acceptable for commercial projects, but not for home improvement contracts. If a homeowner is leery of signing a contract for the job—thinking you're making too much profit on such a simple project—you might say "What if we agree on the job for the cost of my time and materials?"



Unfortunately, once the consumer realizes that the total keeps going up with no finish date in sight or other problems occur, he or she is contacting CSLB with a complaint and an investigation is opened.

The first thing you learn from the Home Improvement Contracts section of the California Contractors License Law and Reference Book is that there is no provision for time and material contracts in home improvement projects. Time and material agreements violate legal subsection guidelines that are required for home improvement contracts such as start and stop dates, and the firm payment schedule that specifically references the completed work. A total or fixed contract price must be identified when payments are made; they must directly relate to work that has been completed.

If you are found to be in violation of the law, the minimum you will receive is a Business and Professions Code Section 7159 violation warning letter—not what you wanted from an "easy" job.

Protect yourself, and provide the proper home improvement contract for all jobs over \$500. Preprinted contract forms with the appropriate legal notices to the consumer are available through contractor book stores, business supply stores, and online business form sites. You can also download the CSLB publication *Contracting for Success – A Guide to Home Improvement Contracts*.

Remember: A good contract protects you and your customers.



Faster, Easier Online Surveys

- Removal of an HVAC unit or system; or
- Adding ducting.

If a contractor fails to obtain a permit and performs contracting work on a project requiring a permit, the contractor is in legal violation and will be disciplined by CSLB, per Business and Professions Code Sections 7110 and 7090. Disciplinary action may include assessment of civil penalties of up to \$5,000 per citation and/or suspension or revocation of the contractor license.

Remember the long surveys you've received in the mail from CSLB's Testing division—you know, the ones that ask you to rate the importance of various tasks and knowledge in your profession? Those surveys, called occupational analysis questionnaires, assist CSLB in determining what information should be covered on licensing examinations.

The surveys are typically mailed out every five years for each licensing examination. In case you're counting, that's nine different surveys each year (45 licensing examinations divided by 5 years). That's a lot of a paper, postage, and information-processing hours.

Thank goodness for online surveys that are easier, faster, and save money. CSLB's Testing division is in the process of transitioning to a computer-based occupational analysis questionnaire where the only thing you'll have to do is click on the answer to the survey questions and send it back to CSLB.

As more online services become available, it will be even more important for you to make sure that you provide CSLB with your current e-mail address on your license renewal form or when you change your online address.

CSLB depends on contractor input in order to provide licensing examinations that reflect current trade practices and gathers this information by conducting workshops with licensees. Test questions are created and reviewed by licensees as part of the examination development process. Any contractor who participates is compensated for time and travel expenses. If you are interested in helping develop your trade's examination, contact CSLB's Testing division at 916.255.3221.

Prepare for New Mechanic's Lien Notice

CSLB reminds you that new mechanic's lien requirements take effect January 1, 2011.

A Notice of Mechanic's Lien must be served on the property owner, and a Proof of Service Affidavit to that property owner must also be completed and signed by the individual serving the Notice of Mechanic's Lien. Failure to serve a Mechanic's Lien Notice and provide a Proof of Service Affidavit will make the mechanic's lien unenforceable.



These changes are the result of [Assembly Bill 457](#) that was signed in 2009, which changes California Civil Code Sections 3084 and 3146.



California's New Green Building Standards Code

Are you ready for CALGreen?

As of January 2011, California's building standards will require that all new buildings reduce water

consumption, employ building commissioning to increase system efficiencies, divert construction waste from landfills, and install low pollutant-emitting finish materials. These provisions establish the minimum of green construction practices and will incorporate environmentally responsible buildings into the everyday fabric of California communities.

The California Building Standards Commission (CBSC) and the **Department of Housing and Community Development** worked closely with the building industry and other trade stakeholders to ensure that the mandatory regulations achieved a balance between significant environmental standards and effective practices that will not substantially drive up construction costs in a slow economy. The California Green Building Standards Code (CALGreen) mandatory measures set sensible minimum standards that are attainable, reasonable and based on good practices, and consequently is supported by the **California Building Industry Association (CBIA)**, **Commercial Real Estate Development Association of California (NAIOP)**, **California Business Properties Association (CBPA)**, **Laborers International (LiUNA!)**, **Building Owners and Managers Association of California (BOMA California)**, and others.



CALGreen has approximately 52 mandatory measures, and an additional 130 provisions that have been placed in the appendix for optional use. Some key mandatory measures for commercial occupancies include specified parking for clean air vehicles, a 20 percent reduction of potable water use within buildings, a 50 percent construction waste diversion from landfills, use of building finish materials that emit low volatile organic compounds, and building

commissioning.

Key optional measures include cool roofs, performance and prescriptive energy measures, increased reduction in landscape potable water irrigation, and building flush out prior to occupancy. Another strategic component is a tiered system designed to allow jurisdictions to adopt codes that go beyond the state mandatory provisions. The nonresidential tiers include increased reduction in energy usage by 15 or 30 percent and increased reduction in potable water consumption, parking for clean air vehicles, cool roofs, construction waste diversion, utilization of recycled materials, and use of low-emitting resilient flooring and

Contractors Receive Time to Comply With Federal Lead Paint Requirements

The United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has announced it will not begin enforcing its Renovation, Repair and Painting Rule until October 1, 2010, to provide more time for contractors to become certified. This rule initially stated that by April 22, 2010, contractors had to have EPA lead-safety certification or risk fines of up to \$37,500 if they did any remodeling or demolition in homes, schools, or childcare facilities built before 1978.

On June 18, 2010, the EPA's Assistant Administrator in the Office of Enforcement and Compliance Assurance issued a memorandum allowing for additional time to allow contractors to complete the training and apply for their certification.

To receive certification, at least one employee of each licensee working in a pre-1978 building must complete an eight hour course from an EPA-approved training provider. The EPA will not fine contractors who have applied to enroll in or have already enrolled in such a class by September 30, 2010. Training must be completed by December 31, 2010, to comply with the federal requirements. Training costs vary by provider.

Once training is complete, the licensee or firm must apply to the EPA for certification, which costs \$300 and is valid for five years. Certification forms and a list of approved training providers

thermal insulation.

The voluntary tiers are designed to become mandatory when adopted by a local jurisdiction. They then fall under the local building department's inspection process. The critical issue of compliance verification of CALGreen is addressed by utilizing the existing building code enforcement infrastructure. Local jurisdictions will incorporate CALGreen code provisions into their construction field inspections.

In an effort to assist with the implementation of CALGreen, CBSC is taking advantage of existing training programs within the building industry, developing educational materials and program curriculum, and working toward partnerships with stakeholder organizations. CALGreen is currently available online and was published on July 4th along with the rest of the **California Building Standards Code, or Title 24**, which was adopted in January. The effective date for the 2010 California Building Standards Code, which includes CALGreen, is January 1, 2011.

It is not necessary to submit your EPA certification or proof of lead-safety course completion to CSLB.





Stay Safe in Excavation Sites and Trenches

The risks of falling, asphyxiation, drowning, and cave-ins are realities when performing excavation and trench work. Be sure to follow these safety guidelines from the California Division of Occupational Safety and Health:

1. Provide daily inspection of excavations, protective systems, and adjacent areas to prevent potential hazards such as soil instability, air toxicity, and equipment failure.
2. Under California Code of Regulations Article 6, Section 1541, a "competent person" must be present on site while work is being performed at all times.
3. If a trench is more than 4 feet deep, a ladder, ramp, or other means of access must be within 25 lateral feet of workers.
4. Shoring or other means of protection must be present on excavations 5 feet or deeper and must be installed from the top down and removed from the bottom up.
5. Materials, equipment, and excavated material (spoils) should be at least 2 feet away from the edge of the excavation site.
6. Use retaining devices, such as a trench box that will extend above the top of the trench, to prevent equipment and spoils from falling back into the excavation site.
7. Idling vehicles are not allowed near excavation sites; exhaust fumes can settle inside the trench, putting workers at risk of asphyxiation.
8. Heavy machinery cannot be operated above slopes, cuts, banks and cliffs when employees are working below.
9. Excavation sites should be barricaded around the perimeter.
10. Emergency rescue equipment, such as breathing masks, safety harnesses, or basket stretchers, should be readily available when hazardous conditions exist or are expected to develop during excavation.
11. When evidence of a potential cave-in is present, all work near and around the work site must be stopped until a registered professional engineer determines it is safe to resume work.
12. No work should ever start unless permits are obtained and appropriate safety precautions are taken to keep employees safe.





No-Cost Consultations Put Safety First

Workplace safety is a must for anyone in the construction industry. If you're not sure about certain requirements, it's best to ask an expert.

The California Division of Occupational Safety and Health (Cal/OSHA) provides on-site consultation services to help reduce and prevent workplace safety hazards. These services are free of charge and confidential, so there is no risk of citations or fines. The only condition is that you must correct any hazards Cal/OSHA identifies.

Consultants will be able to analyze and find ways to correct any potential safety or health hazards that may put employees at risk. They can also review written safety procedures and make suggestions on how to improve your established practices.

A phone call to your local Cal/OSHA office, listed at right, gets you started. A Cal/OSHA consultant will then contact you to set up an appointment for an on-site visit. Be sure to have your company's safety programs, workers' compensation loss runs, and any Cal/OSHA Form 300's prepared and on hand before the consultant arrives.

Protect Yourself Against Professional Identity Theft



Licensees can quickly become a victim of identity theft when their CSLB license information is stolen from an online source.

Be aware that if you post an image of your CSLB license or pocket license on your website, dishonest individuals can easily copy, save and print your information to defraud both your business and unsuspecting consumers.

CSLB recommends that you watermark these images before you post them online to prevent criminal use of your license.



Heat Regulations Reminder

Heat-related illnesses can be deadly, so be sure to protect yourself and your employees during California's hot summer and early fall months.

According to the California Division of Occupational Safety and Health (Cal/OSHA), 41 heat-related illnesses and one fatality were reported in 2009. Cal/OSHA also reported in 2009 that 16 job sites were shut down and 1,158 citations were given to employers who were found to be in violation of health and safety guidelines.

Training for employees is both mandatory and a helpful tool in preventing heat-related illnesses. Before beginning to work outdoors, workers should be made aware of the symptoms of heat-related illness, the company's emergency procedures, and the importance of drinking plenty of water and taking breaks in the shade.

When temperatures exceed 85 degrees, shade must be provided for all employees. Supervisors should also encourage employees to take regular rests in the shade for at least five minutes at a time. The amount of shade present should accommodate about 25 percent of workers on the clock at any time, according to Cal/OSHA.

Employers should make water readily accessible to employees during their shift, and workers should drink it often. It is recommended that workers drink four cups (32 ounces) of water every hour, even if they are not thirsty.

If a worker begins to show signs of a heat-related illness, it's important to look for the specific symptoms of either heat exhaustion or heat stroke, and call 9-1-1:

HEAT EXHAUSTION

- Heavy sweating
- Cramps
- Rapid Pulse
- Headache
- Nausea
- Vomiting

HEAT STROKE

- Dry, red, hot skin
- Fainting
- High body temperature
- Disorientation
- Confusion

Be sure to notify CSLB when your business has moved or your telephone number has changed. Failing to update your information could mean major delays in receiving pertinent information related to your license.

CSLB wants to provide you with important, time-sensitive information concerning your license; plus, you are required, by law, to keep your business information up-to-date. Business and Professions Code Section 7083 states that licensees must notify CSLB, in writing, within 90 days of a business address change.

You can access the Application to Change Name or Address at the link below. Failure to do so within the 90-day period can result in administrative citations and/or fines. Keep in mind that if the new address is a post office box, the business street address is required.
