New Requirement for C-47 General Manufactured Housing Contractor License

Applicants for the C-47 classification must show completion of a federally approved installer training program

Effective September 30, 2021, all new applications for a [C-47 – General Manufactured Housing](#) contractor license are required to provide proof of completion of a federally approved installer training course before the [Contractors State License Board](#) (CSLB) can issue a C-47 license. The CSLB adopted this requirement to comply with federal law.

Existing C-47 license qualifiers do not need to complete the training course.

Applicants for a C-47 license can comply with this requirement by submitting with their CSLB license application a “Certificate of Completion of Training” from a qualified trainer approved by the [U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development \(HUD\)](#).
