Complainant alleges:

PARTIES

- 1. Wood Robinson (Complainant) brings this Accusation solely in his official capacity as the Enforcement Supervisor I of the Contractors' State License Board, Department of Consumer Affairs.
- On or about November 30, 2015, the Registrar of Contractors issued Contractor's
 License Number 1009268, B to Sunrooms America, Inc., Constance Ruth Gabriel,
 RMO/CEO/Pres (Respondent). The Contractor's License expired on November 30, 2017, and has
 not been renewed.
- 3. On or about July 19, 2010, the Registrar of Contractors issued Contractor's License Number 950078, B to Bay Area Fun Space Direct, Inc, dba Sunrooms America Direct, Constance Ruth Gabriel, RMO/CEO/Pres (Affiliated Party #1). The Contractor's License expired on April 30, 2015, and has not been renewed.
- 4. On or about June 5, 2015, the Registrar of Contractors issued Contractor's License Number 1004259, B to Gabriel Construction Company, Constance Ruth Gabriel, sole owner (Affiliated Party #2). The Contractor's License will expire on June 30, 2019, unless renewed.

JURISDICTION

5. This Accusation is brought before the Registrar of Contractors (Registrar) for the Contractors' State License Board, Department of Consumer Affairs, under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code unless otherwise indicated.

STATUTORY PROVISIONS

- 6. Section 7090 of the Business and Professions Code ("Code") provides, in pertinent part, that the Registrar may suspend or revoke any license or registration if the licensee or registrant is guilty of or commits any one or more of the acts or omissions constituting cause for disciplinary action.
- 7. Section 7106.5 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the expiration, cancellation, forfeiture, or suspension of a license by operation of law or by order or decision of

the registrar, or a court of law, or the voluntary surrender of the license shall not deprive the registrar of jurisdiction to proceed with any investigation of or action or disciplinary proceeding against the license, or to render a decision suspending or revoking the license.

- 8. Section 118(b) of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the expiration of a license shall not deprive the Registrar of jurisdiction to proceed with a disciplinary action during the period within which the license may be renewed, restored, reissued or reinstated. Under Code section 7076.1, the Registrar may reinstate a cancelled license if the licensee pays all of the fees and meets all of the qualifications and requirements for obtaining an original license.
- 9. Section 7076.5 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the inactive status of a license shall not bar any disciplinary action for violating provisions of the Contractors' State License Law (Bus. & Prof. Code, § 7000, et seq.).
 - 10. Section 7109 of the Code states:
- "(a) A willful departure in any material respect from accepted trade standards for good and workmanlike construction constitutes a cause for disciplinary action, unless the departure was in accordance with plans and specifications prepared by or under the direct supervision of an architect.
- "(b) A willful departure from or disregard of plans or specifications in any material respect, which is prejudicial to another, without the consent of the owner or his or her duly authorized representative and without the consent of the person entitled to have the particular construction project or operation completed in accordance with such plans or specifications, constitutes a cause for disciplinary action."
- 11. Section 7112 of the Code states that "[o]mission or misrepresentation of a material fact by an applicant or a licensee in obtaining, or renewing a license, or in adding a classification to an existing license constitutes a cause for disciplinary action."
- 12. Section 7113 of the Code states that "[f]ailure in a material respect on the part of a licensee to complete any construction project or operation for the price stated in the contract for such construction project or operation or in any modification of such contract constitutes a cause for disciplinary action."

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13. Section 7116 of the Code states that "[t]he doing of any wilful or fraudulent act by the licensee as a contractor in consequence of which another is substantially injured constitutes a cause for disciplinary action."

14. Section 7125.4 of the Code states:

- "(a) The filing of the exemption certificate prescribed by this article that is false, or the employment of a person subject to coverage under the workers' compensation laws after the filing of an exemption certificate without first filing a Certificate of Workers' Compensation Insurance or Certification of Self-Insurance in accordance with the provisions of this article, or the employment of a person subject to coverage under the workers' compensation laws without maintaining coverage for that person, constitutes cause for disciplinary action.
- "(b) Any qualifier for a license who, under Section 7068.1 is responsible for assuring that a licensee complies with the provisions of this chapter, is also guilty of a misdemeanor for committing or failing to prevent the commission of any of the acts that are cause for disciplinary action under this section"

15. Section 7154 of the Code states:

- "(a) A home improvement contractor licensed under this chapter shall notify the registrar in writing, on a form prescribed by the registrar, about the employment of a registered home improvement salesperson, pursuant to the terms of this article. This notification requirement shall include, but not be limited to, the name and registration number of the home improvement salesperson who is employed by the contractor. The form shall be submitted prior to the home improvement salesperson beginning work for the contractor.
- "(b) A home improvement contractor shall notify the registrar in writing, on a form prescribed by the registrar, when a registered home improvement salesperson ceases to be employed by the contractor. This notification requirement shall include, but not be limited to, the name and registration number of the home improvement salesperson who had been employed by the contractor. The form shall be submitted within 90 days after the home improvement salesperson ceases to be employed by the contractor.

- "(c) A home improvement contractor who employs a registered home improvement salesperson to sell home improvement contracts, but who fails to report to the registrar pursuant to subdivision (a) or (b), is subject to disciplinary action by the registrar.
- "(d) A home improvement contractor who employs a person to sell home improvement contracts while that person is not registered by the registrar as a home improvement salesperson as provided in this article, is subject to disciplinary action by the registrar."
 - 16. Section 7161 of the Code states:

"It is a misdemeanor for any person to engage in any of the following acts, the commission of which shall be cause for disciplinary action against any licensee or applicant:

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(b) Making any substantial misrepresentation in the procurement of a contract for a home improvement or other work of improvement or making any false promise of character likely to influence, persuade or, 1 induce any person to enter into such a contract.

. . .

17. Section 7159.5 of the Code states:

"This section applies to all home improvement contracts, as defined in Section 7151.2, between an owner or tenant and a contractor, whether a general contractor or a specialty contractor, who is licensed or subject to be licensed pursuant to this chapter with regard to the transaction.

(a) Failure by the licensee or a person subject to be licensed under this chapter, or by his or her agent or salesperson to comply with the following provisions is cause for discipline:

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(3) If a downpayment will be charged, the downpayment may not exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or 10 percent of the contract amount, whichever is less.

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COST RECOVERY/RESTITUTION

18. Code section 125.3 provides, in pertinent part, that the Registrar may request the administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of

the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case.

19. Government Code section 11519(d), provides, in pertinent part, that the Registrar may require restitution of damages suffered as a condition of probation in the event probation is ordered.

B.Q PROJECT

- 20. On or about August 21, 2016, Respondent, through unregistered salesperson William Gabriel, entered into a contract with B.Q. to construct a sunroom in the backyard of their home in San Jose, California (hereinafter "B.Q. project"). The contract amount was \$98,500.00. Respondent, through unregistered salesperson William Gabriel, asked for and received a payment of \$73,875.00, on August 21, 2016, telling B.Q. that the money would go towards their building materials. Respondent, through unregistered salesperson William Gabriel, promised B.Q. that the sunroom would be substantially completed by December 23, 2016.
- 21. Respondent began partial demolition of the existing concrete patio and removal of the existing sunroom and building eaves on or about September 23, 2016. After seven months of little progress, B.Q. learned that a building permit had not been pulled and thereafter fired Respondent on or about April 18, 2017, at a time when the sunroom had not been completed. B.Q. had paid Respondent \$3,300.00 to remove the existing concrete slab, however Respondent failed to remove the existing concrete slab.
- 22. B.Q. had to hire a correcting contractor to complete the sunroom in or about May 2017. The correcting contractor obtained the required permits and obtained engineered drawings. None of Respondent's work on the B.Q. project was salvageable and it all had to be demolished. B.Q. had to pay an additional \$81,450.00 to complete the sunroom project.

FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Departure From Accepted Trade Standards)

23. Respondent is subject to discipline pursuant to Code section 7109(a), in that on the B.Q. project, it willfully departed from accepted trade standards for good and workmanlike construction by failing to obtain required permits and inspections, and failing to have engineered

1	plans prepared. In addition, all of the work Respondent performed on the B.Q. project was not to	
2	trade standards and was not compliant with building codes and had to be demolished prior to	
3	completing the project.	
4	SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE	
5	(Misrepresentation of a Material Fact on Application)	
6	24. Respondent is subject to discipline under Code section 7112, in that licensing	
7	application documents submitted by Respondent failed to accurately identify William Gabriel as	
8	Respondent's President.	
9	THIRD CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE	
10	(Failure to Complete the Project for the Contract Price)	
11	25. Respondent's license is subject to discipline under Code section 7113, in that on	
12	the B.Q. project, Respondent failed in a material respect to complete the project for the contract	
13	price and the homeowner was required to spend a substantial sum in excess of the contract price	
14	to complete the project in accordance with the contract.	
15	FOURTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE	
16	(Intentional Conduct Causing Injury)	
17	26. Respondent is subject to discipline under Code section 7116, in that on the B.Q.	
18	project, Respondent received \$3,300.00 to remove the existing concrete slab but failed to remove	
19	the existing slab and instead poured new concrete over the existing slab.

SIXTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Utilized Unregistered Salesperson)

28. Respondent's license is subject to discipline under Code section 7154, in that on the B.Q. project, Respondent employed unregistered home improvement salesperson William Gabriel.

SEVENTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Failure to Comply with the Provisions of the Contractors' State License Law)

- 29. Respondent is subject to discipline under Code section 7159.5, in that on the B.Q. project, Respondent failed to comply with the following provisions:
- a. <u>Subdivision (a)(3):</u> Respondent requested and received an excessive down payment in the amount of \$73,875.00.

EIGHTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Failure to Comply with the Provisions of the Contractors' State License Law)

30. Respondent's license is subject to discipline under Code section 7161(b), in that on the B.Q. project, Respondent told B.Q. that the project would be substantially completed by December 23, 2016. In truth and in fact, the project was not completed as of April 2017 when B.Q. terminated Respondent from the project.

OTHER MATTERS

- 31. Pursuant to sections 7097 and 7098 of the Code, if license number 1009268, B issued to Respondent is suspended or revoked, the Registrar may suspend or revoke, without notice, any other license issued in the name of Constance Ruth Gabriel or for which Constance Ruth Gabriel furnished the qualifying experience and appearance.
- 32. Pursuant to section 7121 of the Code, if discipline is imposed on license number 1009268, B issued to Respondent, Constance Ruth Gabriel shall be prohibited from serving as an officer, director, associate, partner, manager, or qualifying individual, or member of the personnel of record of any licensee during the time the discipline is imposed, and any licensee which employs, elects, or associates Constance Ruth Gabriel shall be subject to disciplinary action.

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- 33. Pursuant to Section 7121.5 of the Code, if discipline is imposed on license number 1009268, B issued to Respondent, Constance Ruth Gabriel shall be prohibited from serving as an officer, director, associate, partner, manager, or qualifying individual of any licensee during the time the discipline is imposed, whether or not he had knowledge or participated in the acts or omissions constituting grounds for discipline, and any licensee which employs, elects, or associates Constance Ruth Gabriel shall be subject to disciplinary action.
- 34. Pursuant to section 7122.5 of the Code, the causes for discipline established as to Respondent constitute cause for discipline against individual license number 1004259, issued to Gabriel Construction Company, Constance Ruth Gabriel, sole owner, regardless of whether she had knowledge of or participated in the acts or omissions which constitute cause for discipline against respondent.
- 35. Section 7095 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Registrar in making his order may:
- (a) Provide for the immediate complete suspension by the licensee of all operations as a contractor during the period fixed by the decision.
- (b) Permit the licensee to complete any or all contracts shown by competent evidence taken at the hearing to be then uncompleted.
- (c) Impose upon the licensee compliance with such specific conditions as may be just in connection with its operations as a contractor disclosed at the hearing, and may further provide that until such conditions are complied with, no application for restoration of the suspended or revoked licensee shall be accepted by the Registrar.

PRAYER

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Registrar of Contractors issue a decision:

1. Revoking or suspending Contractor's License Number 1009268, B issued to Respondent;

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- Prohibiting Constance Ruth Gabriel from serving as an officer, director, associate, partner, or qualifying individual of any licensee during the period that discipline is imposed on license Number 1009268, B, issued to Respondent;
- 3. Revoking or suspending any other license for which Constance Ruth Gabriel is furnishing the qualifying experience or appearance;
- 4. Ordering restitution of all damages according to proof suffered by B.Q. as a condition of probation in the event probation is ordered;
- 5. Ordering restitution of all damages suffered by B.Q. as a result of Respondent's conduct as a contractor, as a condition of restoration of license Number 1009268, B, issued to Respondent;
- Ordering Respondent to pay the Registrar of Contractors her costs in the investigation and enforcement of the case according to proof at the hearing, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.3;
- 7. Ordering Respondent to provide the Registrar with a listing of all contracting projects in progress and the anticipated completion date of each;
 - 8. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
