WINDTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING CONDUCTED BY CONTRACTORS' STATE LICENSE ROARD OF CALIFORNIA Hold at Sacramento, California January 15, 1937

The regular meeting of the Contractors' State License Board was called to order by Roy M. Eutcher, Chairman of the Board, at 11:00 A. M., January 15, 1937, in the State Office Building, Sacramento, California.

The roll was called and the following were present:

The minutes of the last meeting, held October 30, 1936 in Oakland, were submitted by the Secretary. It was moved and seconded that the minutes be approved as written. Unanimously carried.

The Secretary read the following report of the Board's transactions and proceedings during the preceding biesnium, which report is to be submitted to the Governor as set forth in subsection (i) of Section 4 of the Contractors' License Law:

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REPORT TO THE COVERNOR OF CONTRACTORS' STATE LICENSE BOARD

"Pursuant to the provisions of Subdivision (i) of Section 4 of the Contractors' License Law, your Contractors' State License Board takes pleasure in presenting merewith to your Bonor the following report of the transactions and proceedings of this body and of its receipts and expenditures for the period ending December 1, 1936.

"Inmediately after your appointment of the members of this Board, in accordance with the amendments to the Contractors' License Law adopted by the Legislature of 1935 and approved by yourself, the Board met and organized, selecting the following officers: Chairman, Warren A. Bechtel, Jr., Vice Chairman, Relph E. Somann.

"The following standing committees were established by the Board and the name of the Board member shown in connection with each was appointed as Chairman: Rules and Procedure Committee, S. G. Johnson; Finance and Budget Committee, William Nies; Personnal Committee, Ralph E. Homenn.

"Meetings of the Board during the 87th Fiscal Year were hald November 18, 1935, February 25 and April 14, 1936.

"At the meeting held on July 17, 1936, first of the 68th Fiscal Year, Roy M. Butcher was elected Chairman and Ralph E. Homann, Vice Chairman. The following were appointed as Committee Chairman: S. G. Johnson, Rules and Procedure Committee; Ralph E. Homann, Finance and Budget Committee; Rugh McBulty, Legislative Committee; and Stephen L. Ford, Personnel Committee.

"The meetings of the Board held during the 58th Fiscal Year were upon the following dates: July 17, August 14, September 25 and October 30, 1936.

"Shortly after organization of the Board it was our pleasure to secure the services of Earl 5. Anderson, at that time a licensee under the Contractors' License Lew, for the position of Registrar and Executive Secretary of the Board. Mr. Anderson continues to hold that position.

"In the following tables we have set forth the number of licentiates for the 87th and the 88th Fiscal Years to December first, and we have segregated such licentiates into those securing original and renewal licenses for each of the two years;

"The income of the Board, almost entirely from license fees, is shown for the two fiscal years in the following table, wherein we have segregated the amounts of fees received for original, removal and delinquent renewal licenses:

"In addition to the fees from licenses the sum of 36,812. 63 was received from miscellansous sources, such as certified copies of licenses, transcripts of evidence, sale of directories, interest on the San Francisco building, etc.

"During the 37th and 88th Fiscal Years 331 formal complaints were filed with the Registrar of the Board. These cases were disposed of with the following punitive actions resulting:

Suspensions	69
Revocations	14
Denials	18

"For a detailed report of the expenditures under the Board, you are respectfully referred to the records of the Department of Professional and Vocutional Standards, of which this Board is a division. In those records you will find an accurate record of all expenditures by the Board under the provisions of the Contractors' License Law, all of which have been approved by the Director of the Department, Mr. William G. Bonelli, and his administrative staff, and the Contractors' License Law.

"In conclusion, your Board desires to state that the operations of this division of the State government have been carried out at all times having in mind your firm position that the State government must be for the service of all and the particular benefit of no individual or meall group. That such a policy has been satisfactorily accepted by the public and by the licentiates of this Board is a matter of established fact -- if this were not so we would not be enjoying the confidence of the construction industry and the representative groups emong the licentiates of this Board, who have from time to time generously given of preise for the administration of the Contraptors' License Law." After the reading of the report to the Governor, Chairman Botcher asked for comments upon the report and general discussion was had, with the result that the Board members held it to be a splendid report. It was noved by Mr. Ford, seconded by Mr. Hiss timt the report be accepted. Unanimously carried.

Mr. Bomann, Chairman of the Finance & Budget Committee, stated that his Committee had no report at this time to render.

Mr. Ford, Cimirman of the Personnel Committee also stated that his Committee and no report at this time to render.

The following letters and communications were read by Earl 6. Anderson, Executive Socretary and Registrar:

Letter to Earl 5. Anderson as Registrar of the Board from Edward Martin of the Electrical Contractors' Association of Northern California, containing a resolution praising the activities of the Contractors' State License Board.

Letter from the Freeno Builders' Exchange to Earl S. Anderson, offering the Board a location for the inspector at a rental of \$15.00 per month. This letter was signed by Harry H. Cayford, Secretary.

Letter from the Bay Builders' Exchange of Santa Monice regarding the moving of their office and requesting a rental of \$15.00 per month for the use of their offices by our inspector. This communication was signed by E. E. Harding, President,

There was a general discussion of these communications from

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the two Builders' Exchanges and Mr. Botohar instructed the Registrar to write to the Exchanges stating that the Board did not feel that it should change the policy adopted last year, at which time it was decided to incur no further expenses for inspectors' headquarters. Mr. Butcher further added that this matter was under the jurisdiction of the Department of Finance. Mr. Anderson stated that he would incorporate the resolution adopted in regard to restals, in the letter engering these requests.

A letter from Charles Morehead, Secretary-Managor of the Contracting Plasterers' Association of Alameda County, Oakland, regarding a contractor by the name of John Sherman applying for renowal of his license, was read by Mr. Anderson; also a letter from L. P. Erb, regarding this matter, together with a letter from the San Francisco Office to Inspector Rahlwes and a letter from Mr. Anderson to Mr. Morehead,

A letter from the Secretary of the Industrial Accident Commission to William G. Honelli, in which commendation was given to the Bureau for the assistance given to the Commission by them in the drive to compel employers to protect their employees with Compensation Insurance, was read. The report of the Legal Department of the Commission was also read relative to the results of this drive.

Mr. interson read several communications from city building departments regarding letters seat out by the Board incorporating the resolution adopted at the last Board meeting relative to

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requiring contractor's to show their State license number when scouring building permits. These communications were from El Centro, Bedlands, Mill Velley and the forms used by the City of Berkeley.

The article in the December 24, 1936 issue of the Los Angeles Times regarding news release sent out by this Board; also the article in "Business Week" were read by Mr. Anderson. Mention was also made regarding the address of Chairman Butcher at the Electrical Contractors' Convention, which was published in the magazine "Electrical West".

A general discussion was hald regarding the keeping of records and books by contractors and Mr. Anderson presented the forms which had been drawn up for use in securing desired information from contractors.

It was moved by Mr. Homann, seconded by Mr. Ford that the matter be submitted to the Committee on Rules & Regulations. Unemisously carried.

At this time Mr. Fred A. Taylor, Assistant Director of the Department of Professional & Vocational Standards addressed a few remarks to the Board, stating that the budget submitted by the Board had been approved by the Department of Finance without any decrease having been made in the appropriation.

Mr. Anderson made a report to the Board relative to the transferring of Inspector Rahlvas from the San Francisco to the Oakland territory, and together with Inspectors Ford and Levey provides this territory with three inspectors. Mr. Anderson

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stated that he hoped this change would clarify the existing unsatiafactory conditions in this district.

Mr. Anderson also reported that Mano Zan was working in the Sacramento district, upon the inquiry of Mr. Homann.

The Secretary reported to the Board that there was a total of 26,052 licensed contractors as of January 1, 1937, as against 23,424 contractors January 1, 1936, making an increase of 2,628.

A news release shortly to be sent out regarding the enforcement work of the Board and the general increased respect for the Law, was submitted by Mr. Anderson.

The meeting recessed at 12:30 P. M. to reconvene at 2:00 P. M., which time was set by Chairman Butcher.

> AFTERNOON SESSION 2:00 P. X., January 15, 1937

The maeting was called to order by Chairman Butcher at 2:15 P. M. in the State Office Building, Excremento.

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It was moved by Mr. Nies, seconded by Mr. Ford, that the Rules & Proceedure Committee make an investigation of the need for an arrangement that would bring to the Board information as to the nature of the books and records kept by contractors of the State of California. Unanimously carried.

a general discussion was held at this time as to the necessary records and a suggestion was made regarding incorporating this information in the application form.

Mr. Anderson presented a request for a Fetition for Review before the Board from the attorney for the Defendant in the cose of C. Warwick Evans -ro- W. O. Warmer. The Petition for Review of this case failed to receive a majority vote of the Board.

At this time Mr. Anderson submitted copies of the Resolution adopted at the last meeting of the Board regarding employees engaging in outside work, which resolution was sent to all employees of the Contractors' State License Board.

Mr. Anderson reported that the Director of Finance had approved the expanse accounts of the Board members at not to exceed \$4.00 per day for scale and not to exceed \$4.00 per day for hotel.

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At this time Mr. William G. Bonelli, Director of the Department of Professional & Vocational Standards, accompanied by Fred A. Taylor, Assistant Director, addressed the Board members relative to the proposed maniments to the Contractors' License Law.

The mosting of the Contractors' State License Board adjourned at 6:30 P. M. to reconvene at 10:00 A. M., Saturday, January 16th.

MORNING SESSION 11:00 A. W., January 16, 1937

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Butcher at 11:90 A. M. in the State Office Building, Sacremento.

Mr. Modulty, Chairman of the Legislative Committee, submitted the following report of the activities of his Committee:

"Your Legislative Conmittee met in Sacramento on December 28, 1936, to discuss amendments to the Contractors' License Law. The members of the Legislative Committee present were Chairman McNulty, S. G. Johnson and Board Chairman Roy M.

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"Also present for conference with the committee were P. M. Sanford, representing the State Builders' Exchanges, Registrar Anderson, Acalstant Registrar Slater and Deputy Registrar Boxdle.

"The number of letters from various associations and interested individuals were considered by the committee but no action was taken, it being full best to evalt an expression of desire from the industries council which at that time was planned. Certain minor changes in the proposed draft of amendments of the date of meeting were authorized, however.

"The committee determined to call a meeting of representatives of all construction associations for January 9 and 10, to be held in Fresno, California, and the Registrar was instructed to send proper notification.

"The legislative committee met in Fresno on January 9 and 10, with representatives from a large majority of the construction organizations of the state.

"The meeting was presided over by Chairman McMulty with members Butcher (ex officio), Homann and Johnson present. Assisting at the meeting wore Begistrar Anderson, Assistant Registrar Slater, and Deputy Registrar Bowdle.

"Representatives of the construction industry associations present were;

"The specific actions of the group were embodied in the motions hereinafter set forth:

"The meeting opened with a motion that any actions taken at this meeting, the majority of votes cast in favor or against any motion shall be considered as expression of these present. Unanimously carried.

"It was moved and seconded that the \$200.00 Exception Clause in the present law be reduced to \$50.00. Unenimously carried.

"It was moved and seconded that Paragraph (b) of Section 2, relating to the exemption on agriculture be eliminated. Unanimously carried.

"It was moved and seconded that Sub-division (1) of Section 5 be adopted as written, with the exception of changing the three years experience to four years and inserting the word "administrative" after the word "rudimentary". This motion was adopted by a majority vote. Those opposing the motion were Mr. Sanford, Mr. Pettifer and Mr. Hasi.

"It was moved and seconded that there be inserted in Section 3, the words "excepting certified architects or registered civil engineers acting solely in their professional capacity." Unanimously carried.

"It was moved and seconded that there be inserted provision that no renewed licenses will be required to take an examination. Unanimously carried.

"It was moved and seconded that the third word in the second paragraph of Sub-division 4 of Section 5, be changed to the words "an original". Unanimously carried.

"It was noved and seconded that the amendment relative to the diversion of funds be inserted and known as Sub-division 14, of Section 9.

"It was moved and seconded that, with the exception of the foregoing changes the mendments as submitted to the group be approved as written. Unanimously carried. "As a result of the calling together of the above represontatives an organisation was set up to be known as the "Construction Industry Council" to act as the representative of all construction organizations in connection with legislative matters desired by the entire industry. The formation of this organization was not accomplished as an action of your legislative committee, although it was the outcome of the meeting called by the committee.

"The meeting of the Legislative Counittee was adjourned January 10. Next to meet at the call of the chairman after a presentation of the counittee's report on recent work for the Board in its session at Sacramento, January 15.

It was moved by Mr. Mies and seconded by Mr. McMulty that the report of the Legislative Committee be accopted. Unanimously carried.

It was moved by Mr. McNalty and seconded by Mr. Nies that the Soord go on record as favoring the introduction before the Legislature of the Amendmonts as approved at the meeting in Fresho on January 9, 1937, of the Construction Industry Council. Unanimously carried.

It was moved by Mr. Mies and seconded by Mr. McMulty that the following resolution relative to the Attorney General defending State officials and State employees when such officials and employees are sued in their official capacities, be sent to the Governor. Unanimously carried.

> "THEREAS, The Attorney General of the State of Califormis is not permitted by law to defend State Officials and State employees except where such officials

and employees are suid in their official capacities, and

"WHEREAS, State employees and officials are frequently sued as individuals on account of acts properly done in their official capacities, and

"THEREAS, in such instances it is necessary that such officials and employees employ counsel for their com defense on account of such proper official duties, therefore

"BE IT RESOLVED, That the Contractors' State License Heard, in regular session assembled this loth day of January, 1937, does recommend to his Henor Governor Frank F. Merriam that he approve, if pessed by the Legislature, a bill reading in substance as follows:

"Whenever any suit for damages is brought against any officer or employee who is paid in whole or in part from State funds, on account of his official actions in making errects or prosecuting offeness, or swearing to complaints, such officer or employee may, with the consent of the head of the department in which he is employed, have such action referred to the Attorney General, and upon the determination of the Attorney General that such officer or employee parformed his official duty in good faith and without melice, it shall then be the duty of the Attorney General to appear and defend such officer or employee in such action or authorize any attorney in auch department to appear and defend such officer or employee.

"The costs and expanses involved in such action and any judgment recovered against such officer or employee shall be a lawful charge against the funds of such department by which such officer or employee was employed, and for which he was acting officially; provided, however, that such department may recover from such officer or employee the amount of any judgment, cost or expenses paid out by it under the provisions of this section."

The Secretary submitted to each member of the Board a copy of the minutes of the meeting of the Construction Industry Council held in Freeno on January 9.

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It was moved by Hr. Hotsity and mountail by Hr. Hiss that the mosting adjourn, he must upkin at the sail of the Delrash, Harniquently corrial.
