## 1972—LEGISLATION

Numerous bills affecting building contractors have been introduced at the 1972 Legislative Session — too many to enumerate here. Of particular interest to the Agency and contractors are AB 96 (Johnson) designed to extend regulation by the Contractors' State License Board to the construction, remodel and repair of mobilehomes; AB 616 (Brown) would require contractors to include a statement on all written estimates, bids, contracts, subcontracts, or billing statements stating questions concerning a contractor's responsibilities may be referred to the Registrar of Contractors for answer; SB 432 (Coombs) would add to, amend, renumber and repeal various Sections of the Contractors License Law and is primarily designed to register and regulate home improvement salesmen; AB 1400 (Fenton) would reorganize the Division of Industrial Safety; AB 788 (Townsend) and SB 239 (Song) are similar bills and would require contractors to list their license number on certain written documents and advertising; AB 65 (MacGillivray) would eliminate automatic revocation of a contractor's license which remains inactive for more than ten years.

The above bills are just a few effecting the Contractors License Law. The next *Bulletin* will provide a more comprehensive analysis of legislation concerning contractors.

## WARNING

Each of you by now should be aware of the Federal Safety and Health Act of 1970 known as OSHA. This Act is designed to insure the safety of employees on the job and it does effect every contractor who hires employees. A violation of the Act provides for harsh and immediate penalties. If you have not done so, I

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strongly advise you to look to the provisions of OSHA.

Predating OSHA by many years is the California Division of Industrial Safety set up to provide safety standards and regulate safety in employment in a wide range of industries, one of the most important of which is the construction industry.

You also may be aware of the special emphasis put on employee safety on the job in California (particularly on construction jobs) by a special Committee of the California State Legislature chaired by Assemblyman Jack Fenton. This Committee is holding public hearings on the matter at this time. It is only reasonable to expect that this special Committee study will result in new and amended laws designed to further insure employee safety via the Division of Industrial Safety and the Contractors' State License Board. One proposal, AB 1400 (Fenton), has already been introduced at the present Legislative Session and it is the Registrar's opinion that this bill will become law either in its present form or in an amended form.

There are also provisions in the Contractors License Law (Sections 7109.5 and 7110) which provide for disciplinary action against licensees who may be in violation of the California Safety Law. In addition to punitive actions provided under OSHA, the California Safety Law and the Contractors License Law, violations may also subject you to personal civil liabilities as an employer.

Your employees are your most treasured assets. Your responsibility to look to their health and safety on construction projects is not only a heavy moral responsibility to each of you, but it is and it will increasingly become a heavy legal responsibility. I counsel you to check your job safety program and get it in order. If you do not have a program—GET ONE!

# Highlights

## OF THE APRIL 27 MEETING OF THE BOARD

The Contractors' State License Board met in Los Angeles on April 27th at the new L. A. Convention Center. All Board members were present and there was a very good turnout for the meeting.

By Board Motion, the "1" will be removed from the B-1 for a General Building Contractor. The symbol will read B—General Building Contractor.

The Rules and Regulations Committee petitioned the Board to amend Board Rules 739, Class C-8, Cement and Concrete Contractor; 745, Class C-12, Excavating, Grading, Trenching, Paving and Surfacing Contractor; 741, Class C-15, Flooring, (Wood) Contractor; 752, Class C-21, House and Building Moving, Wrecking Contractor; 746, Class C-20, Warm-Air Heating, Ventilating and Air Conditioning Contractor; and 754.4, Class C-42, Sewer, Sewage Disposal, Drain Cement Pipe Laying Contractor.

The public hearing is scheduled for the July 26, 1972 meeting of the Board to be held at San Diego. The Rules and Regulations Committee is also to conduct a study into the feasibility of establishing a specialty classification for "Fix-It" Contractors.

The Board unanimously passed a motion to amend the C-20, C-38 and the C-4 classifications, to reflect Senate Bill 781 which became law on March 4, 1972, to license those persons engaged in the service, repair and maintenance of air-conditioning, heating or refrigeration equipment. These amendments will become effective within thirty days after filing with the Secretary of State which was done on May 1, 1972.

The petition filed by the California State Electronics Association to establish a separate classification for electronic contractors was granted. The public hearing will be scheduled at the October, 1972 meeting of the Board.

At the July meeting the Board will consider the amendments to the C-12, C-15, C-20 and the C-42 classifications.

## THE UNLICENSED CONTRACTOR

Over the years the problem of the unlicensed contractor has been of serious concern to the construction industry, the agency and increasingly so to the consumer.

The primary intent of the legislature in enacting the contractors license law was the protection of the health, safety and general welfare of the persons dealing with contractors and affording such persons effective and practical protection against the incompetent, unlawful and fraudulent acts of contractors with whom they do business. The consumer can look to the Contractors State License Board to assist in reconciling problems they may encounter arising out of contracts they have with licensees. There is no such recourse for those persons dealing with an unlicensed contractor, by the prosecuting official.

A consumer is often attracted to an unlicensed contractor in the belief he will save a few dollars. This is a fallacy that has been disproven over and over again by actual experience recorded in the files of the Contractors State License Board. In a recent case in the San Jose area six homeowners entered into written contracts with an unlicensed remodeling contractor. The projects ranged from twenty-five hundred to sixteen thousand dollars. The unlicensed contractor collected the major part of the contract price and abandoned the projects while they were substantially incomplete. Liens were filed against the property of the six homeowners and the total damages to the consumers ran in excess of twenty-two thousand dollars. In addition, there were the disruptions to the consumers home and the worry and anxiety connected with the legal problems of completing the job, paying off the suppliers and subcontractors, and clearing up the liens. Every district office of the Board has cases on file reflecting similar experiences at the hands of the unlicensed contractor. A felony warrant has been issued for the arrest of the unlicensed contractor who is charged with six counts of grand theft as well as contracting without a license and false advertising.

In another example of the infamous roof oiling racket four elderly women were victimized by a team of unscrupulous, transient unlicensed contrac-

tors. The homeowners paid him two hundred to over four hundred dollars for worthless aluminum paste and paint thinner sprayed on their roofs. Two of the team were arrested and released on \$1,250 bail each. When the defendants failed to appear for arraignment a bench warrant was issued and a few days later were picked up in Phoenix, Arizona, as fugitives. They were returned to California and booked on a Grand Jury indictment. At their trial both defendants plead guilty with the father being given a term in Vacaville State Facility for one to ten years by the Superior Court Judge and the son fined \$500 and placed on three years' probation.

The above examples may represent more than is usually involved in a nonlicensed operation but are indicative of the dangers in dealing with an unlicensed contractor. In cases such as these the procurement of evidence and the issuance of a criminal complaint is relatively simple. We have all the necessary elements for a successful prosecution including the documentary evidence and above all, willing witnesses.

During the past fiscal year this Agency initiated 5,159 investigations into unlicensed activity. In 3,389 cases we were unable to obtain sufficient evidence to prosecute. Many consumers are reluctant to become involved in criminal proceedings. In other cases because of exemptions or weaknesses in the evidentiary chain we were unable to sustain a request for a criminal complaint. In these instances a warning was given the unlicensed contractor by the prosecuting official.

When substantial evidence of a violation exists the matter is presented to the District Attorney, City Attorney, or Attorney General, in some instances who have authority to prosecute. The agency's only legal function is to investigate the complaint and upon compilation of evidence refer the matter to prosecuting officials. In many areas the District Attorney and the courts are swamped with misdemeanor complaints. The attitude towards prosecution will vary from one jurisdiction to another. Some district attorneys rely more heavily on the citation procedure. An unlicensed contractor is ordered to appear before a deputy district attorney who sets forth the evidence and the possible fine and/or imprisonment which could result from conviction. If it is a first

offense and the nonlicensee is cooperative and agrees to refrain from further unlicensed activity the matter is closed with a warning that future violations will result in a warrant for arrest. Out of 1,780 cases referred to the district attorney, 658 were closed after a citation hearing. The balance resulted in the issuance of a criminal complaint, 648 unlicensed contractors were found guilty by the courts, 109 were found not guilty and warrants for the remainder could not be served.

The above statistics reflect only a portion of the efforts our field staff makes in our attempts to curb unlicensed activity. We had two objectives in mind to prosecute the violator and to secure compliance with the law. Many licensed contractors today were at one time operating without a license and unaware that a license was required.

Compliance is often had after our representative explains the law and along with the possible criminal penalties the fact that an unlicensed person cannot maintain an action in court to collect on a contract for which a license would be required.

In addition to actual performance on a contract the law also prohibits a nonlicensee from advertising in any manner which would indicate to the public that he is a licensed contractor. Policing this area is a large and never ending chore and prosecution of a violator can be difficult.

We subscribe to a clipping service which periodically gleans advertisements from the classified section of every newspaper in the State. These are then referred to the appropriate District for investigation. The Yellow Pages are likewise scrutinized for violations. We have maintained a liaison with the telephone companies in the hope that violative advertising could be cancelled before appearing in the Directory. This has proved fruitful but not entirely effective.

All of our efforts directed toward the unlicensed contractor have not diminished but the increase in consumer problems in other areas has limited the time which we can devote to the problem. As a licensed contractor you can greatly assist us by reporting any violations which may come to your attention. Information forwarded to the Board should include identification of the unlicensed contractor, location of the project upon which he is performing and the

date the work was performed. This information is the minimum necessary to open an investigation, other details that assist if known are the unlicensed person's address, vehicle type and description if known, name of the property owner or person with whom the unlicensed contractor is contracting

and source of the materials or services being utilized on the project. All of this information may not be readily available, however everything beyond the above minimum necessary to assign the complaint to investigation will add to the chance of a successful prosecution.

## BOARD LIMITS WORK OF HOUSE AND BUILDING MOVERS

At the January meeting the Contractors' State License Board amended Section 752 of the Rules and Regulations. This section defines Class C-21 House and Building Moving, Wrecking Contractors.

That portion of the section which formerly permitted a C-21 licensee to complete the rehabilitation of a house or building after it had been moved and to perform the alterations or additions was deleted.

A person licensed as a House and Building Moving, Wrecking Contractor only is now prohibited from performing the alterations, additions, repairs or rehabilitations to the permanently retained portions of such building or structures as remains after being moved, raised, lowered, cribbed or underpinned.

C-21 licensees wishing to contract for such work should secure a supplemental B classification.

## DIRECTOR NAMED TO GOVERNOR'S STAFF

On May 4, Governor Reagan announced the appointment of Donald G. Livingston, as assistant to the Governor and director of programs and policy. He will assume the new position on June 1. Since October 1, 1971, Mr. Livingston has been the Director of the Department of Consumer Affairs.

In his new assignment Livingston will have the responsibility for the development and coordination of major administration programs including consumer affairs, environmental protection and other legislative and executive measures.

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## **NOTICE TO INACTIVATE LICENSES**

In October of 1962 Section 7076.5 was added to the Contractors' License Law providing for the inactivation of a State Contractors' License.

Under the terms of the section a license which has been inactive for a period of ten years shall automatically be revoked. Those licensees who inactivated their license on the 1963/65 renewal application will have until June 30, 1973 to reactivate. They may do so by filing an active renewal ap-

plication at the 1973/75 renewal period.

To keep their licenses from being revoked, an inactive licensee who inactivated between October 1962 and June 30, 1963 must file an application to reactivate their inactive license prior to the expiration of the ten-year period. The licensee must submit with the reactivation the necessary Contractor's Bond in the amount of \$2,500 and the financial statement with the opinion of the C.P.A. or P.A.

required by Section 7067.5 of our license law. If the license is qualified by a responsible managing employee, the Bond of Qualifying Individual must also be included.

All legal requirements for reactivation must be met including the prescribed fee prior to the expiration of the ten-year period. A bad check which is not reimbursed prior to the ten-year period would invalidate the reactivation and cause the license to be revoked.
