Applicant Fingerprinting Delayed

Because of resource issues resulting from the state's budget process, CSLB will implement its new fingerprinting program on January 1, 2005. The Board is legislatively required to begin collecting electronic fingerprints of new contractor and home improvement salesperson license applicants for the purpose of conducting criminal history record checks.

The Board has developed and approved regulations to implement the new legislation and has requested additional funding to support the new workload and necessary equipment. Because fingerprints will be collected through the Department of Justice (DOJ), that agency also had to be granted additional funding and other resources needed to perform its role in the new program.

After January 1, 2005, those applying for a new contractor's license or to be added to an existing license as a sole owner, general partner, corporate officer, or qualifying individual, will be fingerprinted prior to licensure.

In addition, applicants for new home improvement salesperson registration will also be required to be fingerprinted prior to registration.

Individuals already on a contractor's license prior to January 1, 2005, will not be required to submit fingerprints unless they apply to be added to another license. Only those who have already been fingerprinted and for whom a criminal history remains available will be exempt from the new requirement.

Fingerprints will be collected throughout the state via the DOJ's electronic fingerprinting process called Live Scan. Out-of-state applicants may submit fingerprints through Live Scan or by using forms provided by CSLB's Registrar. More information will be provided through the application process and on CSLB's Web site as it becomes available.



CHAIRMAN'S COLUMN

Backlog Reductions




As my term as chairman of the CSLB comes to a close, I am proud of the Board and staff's accomplishments and grace under pressure. This has been a challenging year for all state agencies, but I believe the Board and dedicated staff met those challenges and achieved significant successes this year.

Foremost among those achievements is the elimination of the once-monumental backlog in license processing a year ago. As you know, CSLB lost 20 percent of its staff due to budget cuts at the same time that license applications skyrocketed. As a result, there just weren't enough hands to do the incoming work. The Board took aggressive steps to address the backlog, including staff redirections from other units. The Enforcement and Public Affairs programs were impacted, and the Call Center was virtually shut down, which you may know if you have tried to call a technician lately.

But the biggest impact is on the construction industry. CSLB is responsible for regulating the largest industry in California. It employs 800,000 people and generates hundreds of billions of dollars for the California economy. CSLB program reductions, and subsequent delays in processing licenses, adversely impact the industry, the state's economy, and tax revenues, by impeding the creation of new businesses, employee hiring and projects that drive California's economy and tax base.

The good news is that, with the support of the new Administration, Board staff has virtually eliminated the backlogs. Staff anticipates complete elimination of the backlogs in licensing and testing by June 30. The chart below illustrates the timeline for license processing today, as compared to a year ago:

As always, the Board's priority is to protect consumers and to provide efficient and timely service to contractors so they can operate their businesses successfully and fuel California's economy. Contract Doubles Board's Testing Capability: Backlogs to be Resolved by June

The CSLB entered into a 30-day contract with a professional testing company, Mobile Marketing Testing and Training (MMTAT), to help the Board put an end to its testing backlogs by the time you read this article.

The Board's normal business standard has been to schedule qualified applicants to take the contractors exam within 21 days of being approved. However, as backlogs in license processing have been reduced, the influx of pending applicants has shifted to Testing, causing a backlog in exam scheduling. Despite the Testing Unit's efforts to accommodate applicants by conducting testing sessions up to six days a week throughout the state, the exam wait times have grown. Prior to the contract with MMTAT, applicants were being scheduled for exams as far out as 17 weeks.

As a result of the contract with MMTAT, approximately 5,700 applicants who had been scheduled to test in June, July and August, were rescheduled for May test dates. MMTAT conducted four test sessions each testing day in three locations: San Bernardino, Norwalk and Oakland. The MMTAT Testing Centers operated in conjunction with CSLB's own eight testing centers (with 142 test stations) throughout California.

The MMTAT Testing Centers have a combined 140 test stations and operated just like CSLB's own testing centers. Exams were conducted according to the Board's own testing rules and regulations and results were known immediately.

CSLB hopes to be able to keep up with testing demand again once the backlog is eliminated.

CSLB Turns Challenges of 2003 into Accomplishments

Every state agency and Californian has been affected in some way by the budget crisis—the largest in California's history. For CSLB, as well as most of state government, the crisis has meant a hiring freeze, staff shortages and reduced resources. At the same time, industry developments like a hot real estate market, insurance problems and new legislation have increased the Board's workload. While at one point the outlook seemed grim, during the past year CSLB has achieved some noteworthy accomplishments and successes.

In 2003, both Enforcement and Licensing Unit backlogs were significantly reduced as these programs concentrated resources on matters of immediate urgency, like keeping existing licensees in business and protecting public safety. Meanwhile, the Board also increased consumer awareness about unlicensed activity by publicizing sting results and high profile cases. Finally, CSLB worked with the State Legislature to make strides for consumer protection through new laws.

In addition to managing its ongoing mission, CSLB leapt to the aid of victims of the Southern California wildfires. The Board dedicated more than 1,000 personnel hours to the disaster relief efforts. Staff made media appearances, performed sweeps and stings, distributed 26,000 informational brochures to victims and assistance groups, staffed evacuation centers and Local Assistance Centers and more.

While 2004 has been just as challenging as 2003, CSLB will continue to adapt and meet the needs of contractors and the public as much as possible. Below are some of the Board's most significant accomplishments of 2003:

- Regulated approximately 282,000 licenses;
- Scheduled 55,007 examinations;
- Issued approximately 14,500 new licenses;
- Opened 23,656 complaints, and closed 24,268;
- Reduced the number of cases more than 180 days old from 1,943 to 978;
- Reduced the number of cases more than one year old from 561 to 173;
- Performed 676 Arbitrations;
- Reached approximately 35 million people with consumer protection and enforcement messages.

Cost Index Baseline for Type B Construction Adjusted

As required by the provisions of Government Code Section 66452.6(a), the \$125,000 baseline cost of Type B construction for 2004 has been adjusted using Class B Construction Cost Index of 1.51, as established by the State Allocation Board at its January 2004 meeting. The resulting baseline cost for Type B construction, effective March 1, 2004 is \$188,750.

Lead Regulations Protect the Public

An estimated 400,000 children in the United States today suffer impaired mental and physical development caused by elevated blood-lead levels. Lead in paint, dust and soil is the primary culprit. When properly maintained, managed, and renovated, lead-based paint poses little risk. However, a health hazard develops if proper precautions are not taken when disturbing the paint during the course of renovation, remodeling, and painting preparation. It is the contractor's responsibility to be aware of the regulations and hazards surrounding lead-based paint.

In addition to using safe lead-waste management practices, paid contractors, renovators or in-house maintenance workers planning to disturb more than two square feet of lead-based paint must furnish the homeowner and occupants with the pamphlet "Protect Your Family from Lead in Your Home," and obtain written acknowledgment of the pamphlet from them prior to beginning work.

Several State and Federal regulatory agencies, including the California Department of Health Services (CA DHS), the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the U.S. Department of Housing

and Urban Development (HUD), have adopted rules and regulations that define lead paint hazards, safe lead level standards and lead safety practices.

Protect Your Water Supply with BMPs

Construction can be a dirty business. Contractors often employ dangerous chemicals, paints, solvents, adhesives, etc. that can pollute the State's water supply when allowed to leach into the ground or run down a storm drain.


To ensure that California's water supply is clean, the California Water Board has developed a series of simple procedural guidelines, known as "Best Management Practices" (BMPs). BMPs may include the use of silt fences, wash-out pits, mulch,

sweeping practices and/or the implementation of a formal inspection program, depending on what is most appropriate for the job site.

The State Water Resources Control Board and the Regional Water Quality Control Boards require property owners to get a General Construction Storm Water Permit (water permit) when developing one acre of land or more. Building departments often will not issue a building permit unless it has proof of coverage under the water permit. However, this is not always the case and contractors are ultimately responsible if their activities result in a permit violation.

If the jobsite is less than one acre in size, property owners need to contact their city or county government for local water supply protection guidelines.

2003 Legislation Affects Contractor Licensing

The first year of the 2003-04 legislative session marked several legislative changes for CSLB and contractors. Here is a reminder of the many new laws affecting the Board's licensing rules and regulations.

Renewing a License

Licensees may now file a renewal application for up to five years from the date their license expires. Prior to January 1, 2004, licenses had to be renewed within three years of the expiration date.

The five-year renewal period applies to all expired licenses regardless of whether they expired before or after this new law became effective (January 1, 2004). For example, a license that expired July 31, 2000 may now be renewed until July 31, 2005; likewise, a license that will expire July 31, 2004, can be renewed until July 31, 2009. A delinquent fee is required on all delinquent renewals.

If a licensee fails to renew an expired license within the five year period, and then decides to contract again, he or she will need to reapply for a license and may also be required to take the license exam again.

Bond Upgrade

The amount of the contractor's bond has been increased to \$10,000 effective January 1, 2004. The bond amount will increase again to \$12,500 in January 2007 under the same legislation. The required bond amount for qualifying individuals has not changed. It remains at \$7,500.

For efficiency and convenience, CSLB allowed bonding companies holding California contractors bonds to file a blanket endorsement that automatically increased all contractor bonds written by that company. If you have not received a notice from the Board notifying you of the need to increase your bond, your bonding company most likely elected to participate in the endorsement. It remains the contractor's responsibility to verify his or her bonding status.

To find out if your bond has been upgraded, check your license status at www.cslb.ca.gov or on our toll-free automated phone line at (800) 321-2752. In late January, suspension notices were sent to all licensees who had not upgraded their bond to \$10,000. The suspension was retroactive to January 1, 2004. Licensees with cash deposits on file in lieu of a contractor's

bond have been given additional time to upgrade their deposit to \$10,000 due to the complexities with cash deposits.

Construction Management Education Account (CMEA)

When the Construction Management Education Sponsorship Act (CMESA) was initially enacted, contributions to the CMEA were limited to \$25. Last year, that limit was legislatively removed, enabling contractors to contribute any amount they choose.

Under the CMESA, enacted in 1991 to provide financial assistance to qualified postsecondary educational institutions offering construction management programs at the baccalaureate level or higher, license applicants and licensees can elect to contribute to the CMEA when filing an application or renewing their license.

The contribution is in addition to other required fees. To date, CSLB has collected approximately \$460,000 from contractors wanting to help others become trained in the construction management field.



CSLB's Automated Phone System Shortcuts Change, Fax-Back Feature Added—Call (800) 321-CSLB

A new feature on the Board's Automatic Phone Response System (APRS) now allows selected forms and publications to be immediately faxed to the caller.

Contractors Board Nabs 81 Unlicensed Contractors, Warns Bay Area Consumers

The undercover investigators of CSLB's Northern Statewide Investigative Fraud Team (SWIFT) recently caught 81 unlicensed contractors—a record number—during an elaborate three-week San Francisco Bay Area sting blitz. News of the stings, which aired on all major Bay Area television stations and in print, warned consumers of the dangers of hiring unlicensed contractors and encouraged them to protect themselves by checking with CSLB to ensure their contractor is licensed.

Because of legislation passed just last year, (Section 7028 (b) of the Business and Professions Code) repeat offenders now face even more stringent penalties than ever before. *The law requires anyone having previously been convicted of contracting without a license to serve at least 90 days in jail and be fined 20 percent of the contract price or \$4,500, whichever is more, upon their next conviction. There are few exceptions to the rule.*

Many unlicensed contractors do not comply with workers' compensation laws either. Because they don't pay these overhead costs, they can—and frequently

do—underbid legitimate licensed contractors. The Santa Clara District Attorney's Office plans to prosecute this illegal activity as well. Consequently, nine separate Notices to Appear were issued by the Santa Clara District Attorney's Office at the Sunnyvale sting for violations of workers' compensation requirements.

In preparation for the Bay Area Blitz, investigators called suspected local unlicensed contractors to bid on contracting jobs ranging from kitchen and bathroom remodeling to painting, plumbing, landscaping and electrical work at secret sting houses in San Rafael, Sunnyvale, San Francisco and Burlingame. When the phony contractors submitted a bid of more than \$500 for labor and materials, they were arrested and/or issued Notices to Appear or Administrative Citations carrying fines and possible jail time.

Local law enforcement officers from the San Rafael, Burlingame and San Francisco Police Departments as well as a Deputy District Attorney from the Santa Clara District Attorney's Office provided back up at the stings.

Board staff receives an average of 31 reports of known or suspected unlicensed contracting activity every work day. All reports are investigated and approximately 65 percent result in some form of disciplinary action.

Forty Unlicensed Contractors Face Felony Charges in Fire Zone

Forty fraudulent contractors face felony charges for contracting without a license in the Southern California wildfire disaster areas as a result of the CSLB's enforcement activities and participation in the multi-jurisdictional Disaster Fraud Management Team (Task Force). Contracting without a license is a felony in a declared disaster area pursuant to Section 7028.16 of the Business and Professions Code. These 40 unlicensed contractors were arrested at a series of stings and sweeps the Task Force conducted between October 2003 and

February 2004 in San Diego, San Bernardino and Riverside counties. Because of the felony status of the crimes, they may be required to pay up to \$10,000 in fines and/or serve up to 3 years in jail.

The fall 2003 wildfires that scarred approximately 750,000 acres of the southern California landscape, leveled 3,577 homes, and claimed more than 20 lives, also left thousands to face the additional trauma of rebuilding their lives and homes. Unscrupulous cons looking to make a quick buck

often take advantage of disaster situations. To protect fire victims from being victimized again during the rebuilding process, CSLB has taken an active role in the Task Force that also includes the Department of Insurance, District Attorney's offices, County Sheriffs and the Office of Emergency Services.

The CSLB continues to thwart unlicensed activity with routine visits to active jobsites in the affected areas where staff verifies license compliance.

Resale Certificates Generally Not Appropriate for Contractors

The Board of Equalization (BOE) reports an increase in the number of cases where contractors have erroneously issued or accepted a resale certificate for contracting materials. These contractors who mistakenly accept a resale certificate in lieu of sales tax, are often required to pay the sales tax themselves.

As a rule, California Sales and Use Tax Regulation 1521, Construction Contractors, restricts the issuance of resale certificates to relieve contractors from their sales and use tax (sales tax) obligations. In most cases, according to Regulation 1521, the contractor who

furnishes and installs materials or fixtures pursuant to a contract to improve real property (whether as a sub or prime) is considered the consumer of all contracting materials. Therefore, the contractor must pay the applicable sales tax, and should consider that cost in the bidding process.

This is the case whether the contractor "sells" the materials to another contractor (as between prime and subcontractors) or a client (homeowner). In almost every situation, the purchasing contractor is liable for the sales tax and should not accept a resale certificate. Few exceptions

to this rule exist, and they can be found in *Publication 9, Tax Tips for Construction and Building Contractors*. For a copy of this publication, go to www.boe.ca.gov/pdf/pub9.pdf.
